Basic regulations

» Regulations:

The championship will be organized according to the rules of the DtHHV. These can be ordered from the DtHHV website dthhv.de for a nominal fee.

» Division into age groups:

In order to be able to compare the participants fairly, all exams are divided into the following age groups:

U9	born 2018-2016
U12	born 2015-2013
U15	born 2012-2010
U21	born 2009-2004
U31	born 2003-1994
U99	born 1993 and older

The organizer reserves the right to only open individual classes if there are at least 5 participants. If a class is not opened, the participants will be informed of this.

» Starting Number Limit

Each participant may take part in a maximum of three competitions of the entire event.

This includes the championship competitions as well as the open competitions.

There is a maximum number of starters for each individual competition. Once this number is reached, no further entries can be accepted.

It is not permitted to start in one competition with several hobby horses, but it is possible to present different hobby horses in different competitions.

» Entry Procedure

Entries for the open competitions are only possible online via Equi-Score. The link will be published on www.dthhv.de.

Open competitions: Each participant indicates here the tests in which he/she wishes to participate, according to priority. The first-named test will be accepted (as long as there are still starting places available) accepted in any case. All other (desired) tests will be distributed according to priority and the number of entries received so that everyone can take part in at least two tests. Of course, this is only possible as long as there are still starting places available. There is no limit to the number of tests requested.

Championship competitions: Starters who have qualified for the championship competitions according to the results lists of the qualifications will be guaranteed their starting place, but must still be entered. The entry form will be sent to those who have qualified by e-mail. Participants from the waiting list will move up for starting places in the championship classes that are not mentioned.

» Qualification

Only entries from pre-qualified hobby horsers are permitted for the championship classes 1-3.

» Sportswear

The competitions are held in a sports hall. Indoor shoes must therefore be worn.

Gymnastic slippers and high-quality non-slip socks with sufficient grip and dense rubber covering on the entire sole of the foot are permitted in the dressage tests.

Participation barefoot or in normal socks is not permitted.

The clothing should be sporty, flexible, light and rather tight-fitting (for young people aged from the age of 14, a hand's breadth of abdominal freedom from the waistband is permitted). Shorts and skirts that do not fully cover the buttocks are prohibited. Normal shorts, even with a short skirt over them, are permitted.

» Hobby Horse

The Hobby Horse can be any size, horse head shape and color. It consists of a stick with a horse's head made of fabric, filled with absorbent cotton, foam or polystyrene.

A hard horse head made of e.g. synthetic resin is also permitted. The Hobby Horse must have a free space of at least 3 (adult) fingers wide between the mouth and neck and a minimum weight of 300 g including test equipment.

The length of the stick from the end of the neck to the end of the stick must be at least 25 cm. The length must be adapted to the rider to ensure that the pole is between the hobby horser's legs at all times.

» Notes on image and sound recordings and their publication

We would like to point out to all participants or their legal guardians that the German Championships of the German Hobby Horing Association is a public sporting event. The participants, or their legal guardians, agree with their entry that video and audio recordings may be made.

- » The regional and national press will be on site if necessary and report on print and online media with photo and film coverage.
- » Participating clubs can also take and use photos and films for their own public relations work.
- » The German Hobby Horing Association will take photos on site and publish these photos on the website for all participants and interested parties in a gallery and interested parties as part of a gallery.
- » Social media sites will also be filming and photographing on site. The photos and videos will then be shared on Instagram, Facebook, YouTube and Tiktok.
The recordings can also be shared there.

» Notes on data protection

The information provided in the entry form will be used exclusively for the purpose of organizing the show and may be passed on by the organizer to external service providers (entry service, judges) for this purpose. Start and result lists will be published on the website **www.deutscher-hobby-horsing-verband.de** and social media page **[deutscher_hobbshorsing_verband](https://www.instagram.com/deutscher_hobbshorsing_verband)** of the organizer and on Equiscore and stored there for this purpose.

The following data can be displayed in the lists:

- » Surname, first name, year of birth and club of the participant Name und Head number of the Hobby Horse
- » Test name, score, time, placing
- » Championship title

» Special provisions:

Participants must bring their own head numbers. These will be attached to at least one side of the Hobby Horse bridle. The numbers on the head numbers must be clearly readable.

All participants will receive a link by e-mail at the beginning of September, which they can use to view the starter lists with the head numbers and the time allocation. The participants for the championship classes (dressage freestyle difficult, time jumping difficult and style jumping difficult) must be members of the German Hobby Horsing Association (either registered by the club or individually).

For insurance reasons, all participants should belong to a club that offers hobby horsing. If this is not the case, it is strongly recommended that you take out private accident insurance.

All visitors and participants are personally liable for damage to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their representatives or the items they bring with them. We accept no liability whatsoever for the checkroom and valuables of participants and visitors.

The instructions of the organizer on location must be followed.

By submitting the entry form, all participants or their legal guardians declare that they agree to all the above provisions of the invitation to tender.

» Entry fee:

The entry fee must be paid when submitting the entry via Equi-Score. The championship competitions are paid in advance via PayPal, Stripe or bank transfer. Payments received after the entry deadline will not be considered. In this case, participants on the waiting list will move up.

» Readiness to start:

The readiness to start must be declared at the registration office at least one hour before the start of the competition. For the first competitions of the day, readiness to start must be declared the evening before. This can be done online via Equi-Score. Participants who start in several competitions can declare their readiness to start for all competitions at the first declaration of readiness in order to avoid queues at the registration office. All participants will receive an information email from Equi-Score before the start of the tournament. Please note that logging in only works under "WBO", this will also be explained again in the email.

» Prevention:

Cancellation of participation is only possible until the entry deadline. Entry fees already paid cannot be refunded in the event of cancellation after the closing date..

» Spectators:

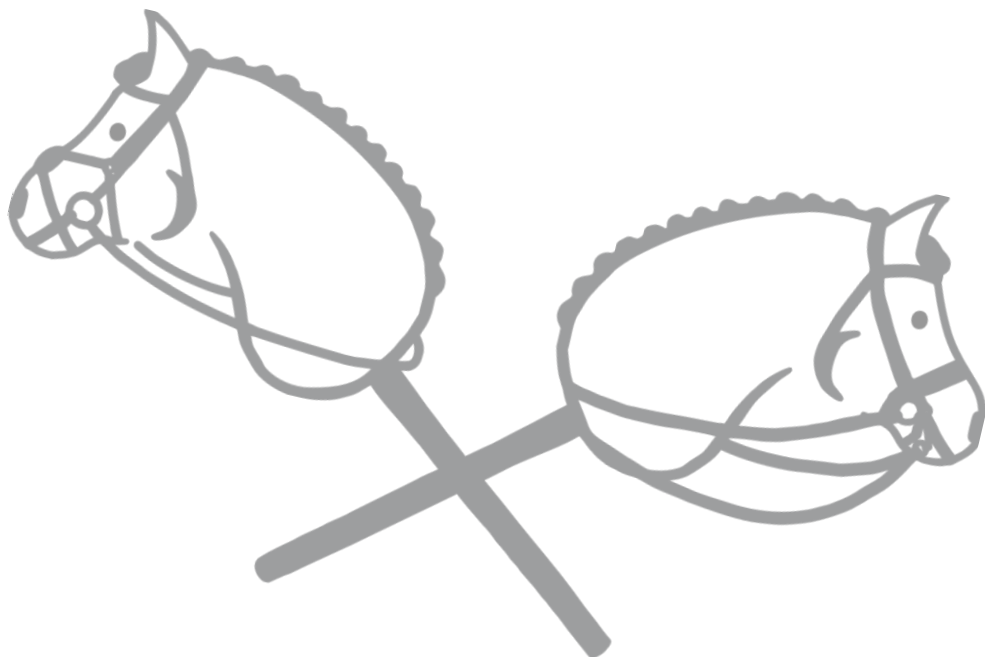
The sports hall has a grandstand and a sales area. Catering will be provided. Only athletes and trainers/supervisors are allowed in the competition area (max. 2 per club or individual starter).

» Exhibitor:

Exhibitors in the field of hobby horsing are welcome after prior registration. The exhibitors will be presented on the website of the German Hobby Horsing Association and on social media before the show.

The following regulation applies:

- » Pitch rental per table (max. 1.20 m): €20 per day and sponsorship of a competition (pitch 1-3)
- » A table space will be allocated. Tables with chairs can be provided for a fee.
- » The space will be permanently reserved as soon as the fee has been paid and the sponsor prices have been received by the association.



General conditions for the competitions

Competition 1:

Dressage freestyle difficult - German Championships, including final

- » Eligible to participate are the age groups U12, U15, U21, U31/U99, who have qualified in advance. Due to low entry numbers the age groups U31 and U99 will be merged.
- » Only participants with permanent residence in Germany or with German citizenship.
- » The dressage freestyle is ridden by heart.
- » U15, U21: Dressage arena 7 x 21 m
- » U12, U31/U99: Dressage arena 7 x 14 m
- » The participants of each authorized age group present a self-created dressage routine with suitable music. Decorations on the Hobby Horse are permitted. Costumes are not permitted.
- » The five best participants in each age group ride the task listed below against each other in the **final**. This must also be ridden by heart.
The ranking of this final determines the German champion in this discipline.

Regulations for the freestyle:

U12, U31/U99:

Dressage arena: 7 x 14 m

Duration 2 to 3 minutes

The freestyle must include all basic gaits and at least the following figures/lessons:

Piaffe and/or passage, pirouette (in canter), traversal, series changes (flying canter changes from jump to jump or to two or three jumps), collection and strong tempi (in two of the three basic gaits), circle, volte.

U15, U21:

Dressage arena: 7 x 21 m

Duration: 3 to 4 minutes

The freestyle must include all basic gaits and at least the following figures/lessons:

Piaffe, passage, pirouette (in piaffe or canter), traversal (trot and canter), series changes (flying canter changes from jump to jump or to two or three jumps), collection and strong tempi (in two of the three basic gaits), serpentine line, about turn.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles made of any material with closed reins and a bit piece with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles are also permitted. In addition, a dressage curb bit with two reins may be used. Fly ears, leg protectors on the rider's leg (as long as they do not pose a risk of accident) and a tail at the end of the bit are also permitted.

The following are not permitted:

All types of auxiliary reins, jumping curbs, spurs and crops.

Rating:

There is a protocol with

A-Grade:

Posture, rein position, hobby horse posture, execution of lessons and figures, tempo and rhythm, execution of gaits.

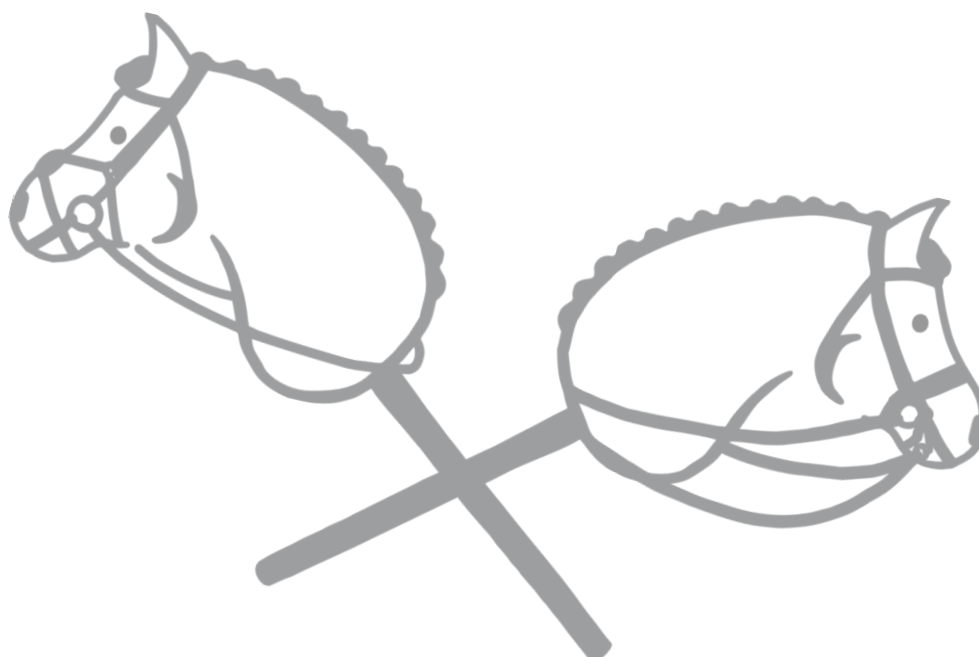
A score is awarded for each required lesson/track figure. Some lessons, such as piaffe and pirouette, have a coefficient. A final score is calculated from these individual marks.

B-Grade:

Appearance, harmony, choreography, difficulty of the performance, choice of music and sense of rhythm.

Overall grade:

A grade + B grade : 2 = final grade

Rating:

Posture, rein position, tempo and rhythm, execution of gaits.

There is one score per lesson/track figure. For some lessons, such as piaffe and pirouette, there is a coefficient. A final score is calculated from these individual grades.



Competition 2:

Style jumping - German Championships, including final | Jumping arena 10 x 20 m

- » Eligible to participate are the age groups U12, U15, U21, U31/U99 who have qualified in advance. Due to low entry numbers, the age groups U31 and U99 will be merged.
- » Only participants with permanent residence in Germany are eligible to participate or with German citizenship.
- » The age groups U12, U31/U99 are eligible to participate in style jumping 50 cm, the age group U15 in style jumping 60 cm and the age group U21 in style jumping 70 cm.
- » The course will not be announced in advance. A sketch will be displayed on site and there will be a course inspection. The obstacles may not be jumped over.
- » The five best participants in each approved age group will start a jump-off course in the final. The ranking of this final determines the German champion in this discipline.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted. Fly ears, breastplates and martingales are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All other types of auxiliary reins, dressage curb bit, spurs and a tail at the end of the bar.

Rating:

- » Posture, rein position, hobby horse posture, speed and beat, execution of gaits, lines, correct hand canter, orientation.
- » The course must be ridden at a gallop throughout.
- » The obstacles must be overcome in the order given.
- » Each down and each refusal results in a 0.5 point deduction from the score.
- » Three refusals, a fall, jumping from the wrong side of the obstacle or riding off lead to exclusion.
- » The Hobby Horse's stick must remain between the Hobby Horser's legs at all times. In the event of repeated non-compliance, the hobby horser will be disqualified.
- » The reins must be held in both hands at all times. In the event of repeated non-compliance, the hobby horser will be disqualified.
- » Disqualification also results in: loss of the intact Hobby Horse e.g. break between bar and Hobby Horse head, open seam = filling falls out, material fatigue on the course (e.g. the reins break).
- » There is a protocol with a score between 5 and 9 with one decimal point.

Competition 3:

Time jumping - German Championships, including final | Jumping arena 10 x 20 m

- » The age groups U12, U15, U21, U31/U99 who have qualified in advance are eligible to participate. Due to low entry numbers, the U31 and U99 age groups will be merged.
- » Only participants with permanent residence in Germany or with German citizenship.
- » The age groups U12, U31/U99 are eligible to participate in the 50 cm time jump, the age group U15 in the 60 cm time jump and the age group U21 in the 70 cm time jump.
- » The course will not be announced in advance. A sketch will be displayed on site and there will be a course inspection. The obstacles may not be jumped over.
- » Start and finish line are marked.
- » The time begins and ends when the start/finish line is crossed. The time is measured electronically using a light barrier.
- » The five best participants in each age category start a jump-off course in the final. The ranking of this final determines the German champion in this discipline.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted. Fly ears, breastplates and martingales are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All other types of auxiliary reins, dressage curb bit, spurs and a tail at the end of the bar.

Rating:

The time jumping competition is about the fastest time with the fewest penalty points.

- » The course must be ridden at a canter throughout. For each gait fault 1 fault point is awarded. Example: If there is no clear canter between the start and the first obstacle, between two obstacles or between the last obstacle and the finish, 1 fault point is awarded. Gait faults are only scored after three consecutive incorrect gaits.
- » The obstacles must be overcome in the order given.
- » Each drop and each refusal result in 4 fault points each.
- » Riding off counts as a refusal and therefore also results in 4 faults. If the refusal is not corrected, it leads to exclusion.
- » Refusing to jump three times, jumping from the wrong side of the obstacle and a fall also lead to disqualification.
- » The Hobby Horse stick must remain between the Hobby Horser's legs at all times. In the event of repeated non-compliance, the Hobby Horser will be disqualified.
- » The reins must be held in both hands at all times. In the event of repeated non-compliance, the Hobby Horser will be disqualified.
- » Disqualification also results in: loss of the intact Hobby Horse e.g. break between stick and Hobby Horse head, open seam = filling falls out, material fatigue on the course (e.g. the reins break).
- » The ranking order is determined by the fastest time with the fewest penalty points.

Competition 4:

Gallop race - open, international competition | oval track

Requirements:

- » The age groups U9, U12, U15, U21, U31/U99 of all nations are eligible to participate.
- » The gallop race is held on an oval track. The curves have a slight uphill gradient towards the outer track.
- » In the age groups U9, U12 the distance is 50 m (one straight line of the oval track), in the age groups U15, U21 and U31/U99 the distance is 100 m (= half of the oval track).
- » There are four heats with four starters in each age group. The respective winners of the heats compete against each other in the final.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted.

Not permitted are:

Tail at stick end, all types of auxiliary reins, dressage curbs, fly ears, spurs.

Rating:

- » The rider must canter continuously between the start and finish line. A gait fault (three consecutive incorrect steps) leads to disqualification.
- » Start and finish line are marked.
- » The times are measured individually for each participant using a stopwatch.
- » Leaving your own track leads to disqualification.
- » Obstructing the other participants will also lead to exclusion.
- » The respective finish line is recorded on video so that in the event of close results be able to determine who crossed the finish line first.

Competition 5:

Time jumping 40 cm - open, international competition | jumping arena 10 x 20 m

- » The age groups U9, U12, U15, U21, U31 and U99 of all nations are eligible to participate.
- » The course will not be announced in advance. A sketch will be displayed on site and there will be a course inspection. The obstacles may not be jumped over.
- » Start and finish line are marked
- » The time begins and ends when the start/finish line is crossed. The time is measured electronically using a light barrier.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted. Fly ears, breastplates and martingales are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All other types of auxiliary reins, dressage curb bit, spurs and a tail at the end of the bar.

Rating:

The time trial is about the fastest time with the fewest penalty points.

- » The course will not be announced in advance. A sketch will be displayed on site and there will be a course inspection. The obstacles may not be jumped over.
- » Start and finish line are marked
- » The time begins and ends when the start/finish line is crossed. The time is measured electronically using a light barrier.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted. Fly ears, breastplates and martingales are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All other types of auxiliary reins, dressage curb bit, spurs and a tail at the end of the bar.

Rating:

The time trial is about the fastest time with the fewest penalty points.

- » The course will not be announced in advance. A sketch will be displayed on site and there will be a course inspection. The obstacles may not be jumped over.
- » Start and finish line are marked
- » The time begins and ends when the start/finish line is crossed. The time is measured electronically using a light barrier.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted. Fly ears, breastplates and martingales are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All other types of auxiliary reins, dressage curb bit, spurs and a tail at the end of the bar.

Rating:

The time trial is about the fastest time with the fewest penalty points.

- » The course must be ridden at a canter throughout. For each gait fault 1 fault point is awarded. Example: If there is no clear canter between the start and the first obstacle, between two obstacles or between the last obstacle and the finish, 1 fault point is awarded.

Competition 8:

Hobby Horsing High Jump - open, international test | Arena at least 7 x 14 m

- » The age groups U12, U15, U21, U31 are eligible to participate.
- » This test includes only one obstacle, which is raised after each round.
The starting height is 80 cm.
- » From the starting height, the height is increased by 5 cm.
- » From 100 cm, the height is increased by 3 cm.
- » From a height of 121 cm, the height is increased by 1 cm.
- » Each participant has two attempts for each round.
If two attempts are unsuccessful, the participant is eliminated and their ranking is determined.
- » The starting height must be jumped over by each participant. After that each Hobby Horser can decide from which height he wants to continue jumping.
This decision must be communicated to the judge after the first jump and can no longer be changed.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless snaffles and jumping curbs are permitted. Fly ears, breastplates and martingales are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All other types of auxiliary reins, dressage curb bit, spurs, whip and a tail at the end of the bar.

Rating:

- » The competition is scored in relation to body size according to the standard method.
- » Participants will be measured with shoes before the start of the test.
The exact time will be announced with the time allocation.
- » It is permitted to hold the reins one-handed with the stick hand.
- » The order of placement is determined by the height jumped in relation to height.

Competition 9:

Medium dressage - open, international competition | Dressage arena 7 x 14 m

- » The age groups U9 and U12 of all nations are eligible to participate
- » The exercise is ridden by heart. Each participant is free to bring along a reader.

Permitted equipment:

Bridles made of any material with closed reins and a bit piece with bit rings of any material. Bitless bridles are also permitted.

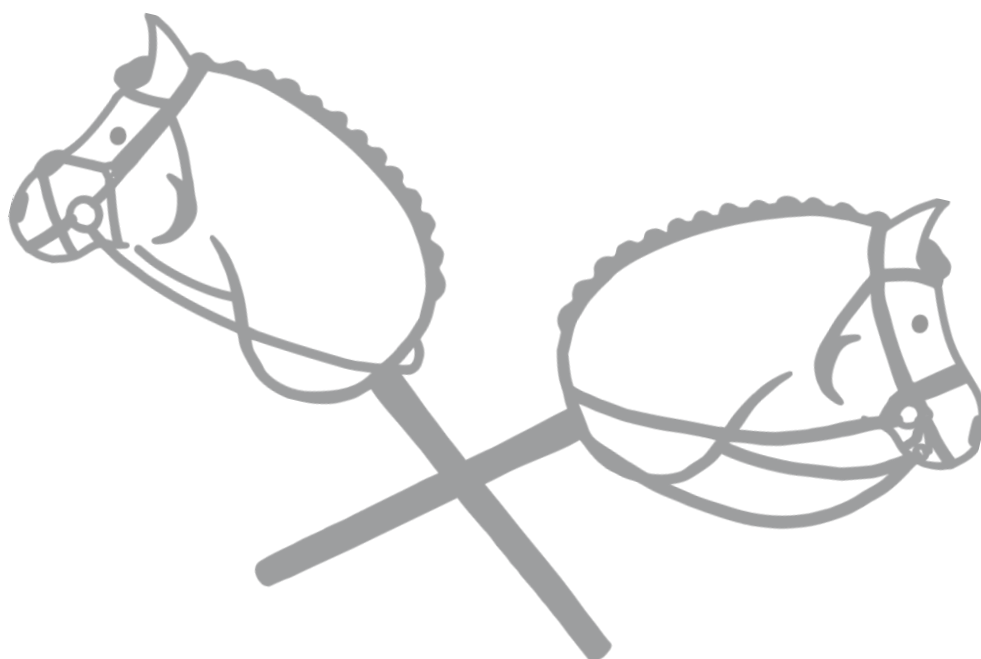
Fly ears, leg protectors on the rider's leg (as long as they do not pose an accident risk) and a tail at the end of the stick are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All types of auxiliary reins, jumping curbs, spurs and crops.

Rating:

- » Posture, rein position, hobby horse posture, execution of the lessons and figures, tempo and beat, execution of gaits.
- » There is a protocol with a score between 5 and 9 with one decimal point.

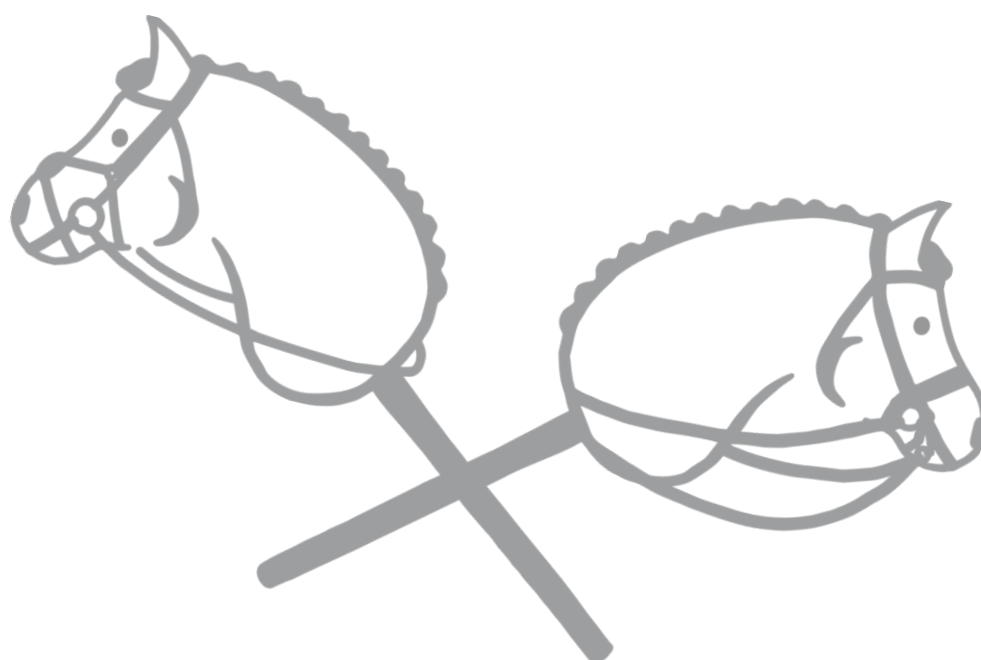
Bridles of any material with closed reins and a bit with bit rings of any material. Bitless bridles are also permitted. In addition a dressage curb bit with two reins may be used. Fly ears, leg protectors on the rider's leg (as long as they do not pose an accident risk) and a tail at the end of the stick are also permitted.

Not permitted are:

All types of auxiliary reins, jumping curbs, spurs and crops.

Rating:

- » Posture, rein position, hobby horse posture, execution of the lessons and and figures, tempo and beat, execution of gaits.
- » There is a protocol with a score for each lesson/track figure and other assessment criteria. Some lessons, such as piaffe and pirouette, have a coefficient. A final score is calculated from these individual marks.
